12-Year-Old Works Hard, And Enjoys It

Working is not the way most people would describe a 12-year-old boy's primary interest during the summer. However, for Joey Whitehurst, working is just a part of everyday life.

Joey, a seventh-grader at Greenville Christian Academy, takes care of chickens, hunting dogs and a garden daily.

"I get up each day between 6 a.m. and 6:30 a.m. to do my work. I just enjoy it," he said.

Joey decided to start a garden this year. One day in April, he spent about two hours getting the land ready for planting. By the beginning to middle part of May, the vegetables were ready to be picked.

Joey plants various vegetables in his garden which include squash, okra, cucumbers, snap beans, radishes, carrots, beets and onions.

He said that he plants these vegetables because they come up the easiest. "They are good to grow, and I like those vegetables."

He also plants flowers, including zinnias, snapdragons, sunflowers,

His garden, which consists of 15 rows, takes about 30 minutes to an hour each day to maintain. "You just chop it, plow it and pick it," he said.

Joey plans to continue his garden, but add a couple more vegetables. "I will put some peas, broccoli and tomatoes in it next year," he said.

Four days a week, Joey takes his vegetables and flowers to the Pitt County Farmers Market. "I figured this was a good place to sell them," he said.
